Guidelines for trails

The trail system is a key component for education, research, and recreation taking place in the North Campus. The trail system provides convenient access for research and education, for both the UAF scientists and community, and provides recreation opportunities for UAF and the Fairbanks community. The UAF Master Plan directs the North Campus

HOWEVER the trail system and its uses *must* be compatible with the other uses surrounding the North Campus at

Americans with Disabilities Act compliance.

Guidelines for installing trails

The issue of sound lighting has been raised. Due to the potential for noise pollution associated with the current and proposed terminus of the lights by the T-Field road to the southeast corner of the T-Field. The survey
